The Awe of Spring Skiing

If you think skiing is only for those few frozen months of the dead of winter then think again. Spring skiing is the best of both worlds - your favorite sport and moderate temperatures. You may actually get a string of days where you can sport your shades instead of goggles and one less layer gives you the freedom of movement you had almost forgotten was possible.

After a recent trip to Mammoth I am confident they will have a base long past the Easter Bunny's curtain call. And in A-Basin (Arapahoe) the cardboard box races down the hill to the Bar-B-Qs waiting at the bottom will just be getting started.

Whistler /Blackcomb features glacier skiing in the summer as does Mt. Hood. But if you're lonely for full blown winter - think about catching a trip south of the equator for a true out of season experience.

Spring conditions give you a heavier wetter snow - but it's a perfect time to experiment in those soft bumps and on the "groomed" trails just keep a straighter path down the fall line to keep from exerting yourself by pushing the corn snow around. Deals generally abound for this primo experience, so if you haven't made plans yet - what are you waiting for?

Game Over? Wax & Store

OK, we did our best to convince you to extend the season, but if the crocuses and daffodils called you to the dark side, then do the right thing and lovingly ready your ski gear for summer. Get them tuned with a coat of summer wax to protect them during storage. Don't forget to buckle your boots and make sure they don't get stored in the 100+ degree attic. While they're sturdy, they are no impervious to temperature extremes. Give those ski tops and pants a good wash and store them lovingly for next year - or October's swap shop. You want your stuff in good condition whether you decide to use or sell next season.

It's also a good time to take advantage of end of season sales at local shops and the mountains. Jackets and soft goods are significantly reduced and mountain shops are looking to dump their demos at this time of year for cost. And as we said - swap shop will be here before you know it.

Season Endings and Beginnings

What a great ski season we just had! Celebrate it with us at the Spring Fling on Friday, May 6th at Kings Grant. One of the features of the Fling is a slide show of season highlights - not to be missed. See the listing in the social pages of this newsletter for more details.

As one season ends, another begins! Save the date - Wednesday July 20th - for our season opener back on the patio at Ramblewood. Like last year we will open our full menu of trips for the season open for sign-up; they usually sell out the first night! Save up now to make your deposits - it's going to be an incredible schedule for next ski season! And remember, you need to be a member to sign up so renew your membership early so you have all your ski ducks in a row before the big night. The new membership year begins May 1st.

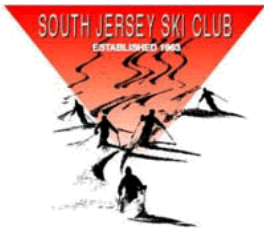
Last Call for the Survey

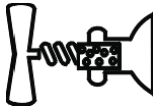

52 KILLINGTON WEEKENDERS EXPERIENCE WESTERN POWDER

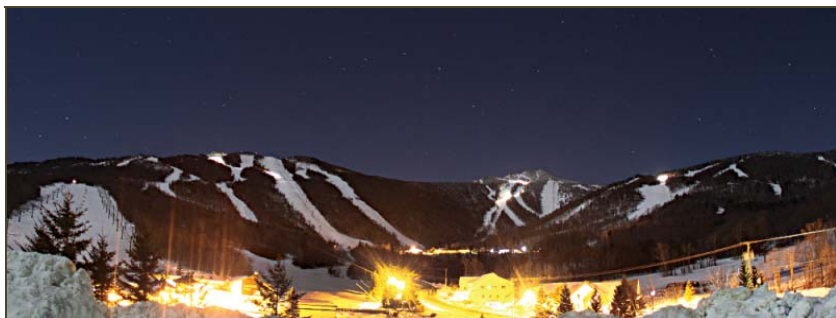

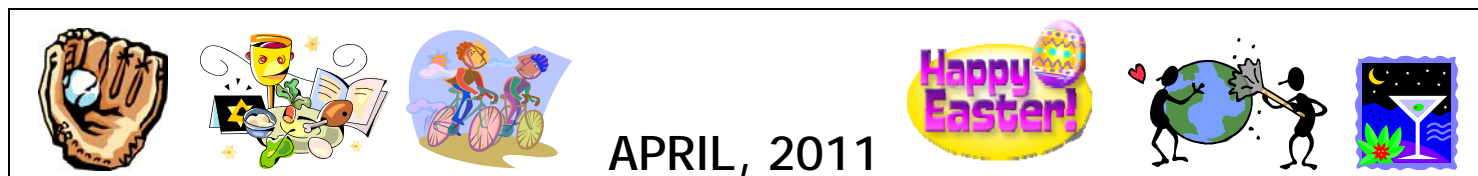

Another SJSC adventure and good time was had by ALL!

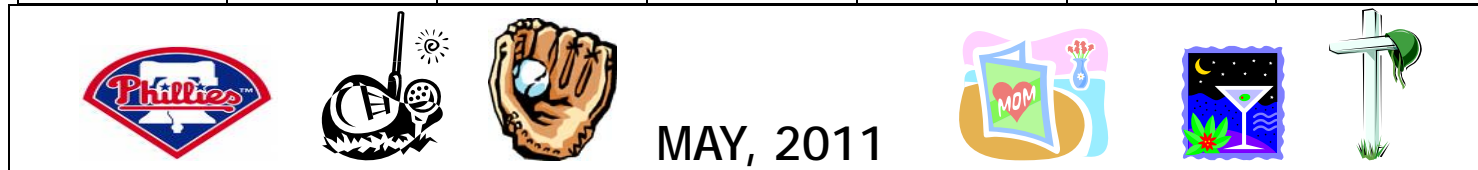
