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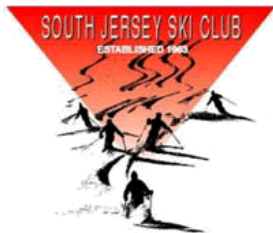

The Next Season

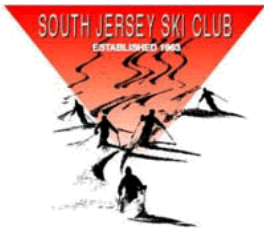
Each edition of Liftlines I post the plans for next season, and as soon as I post them we zig left and then zag back to the right in ski committee planning sessions.

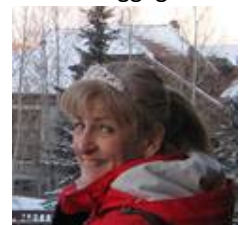

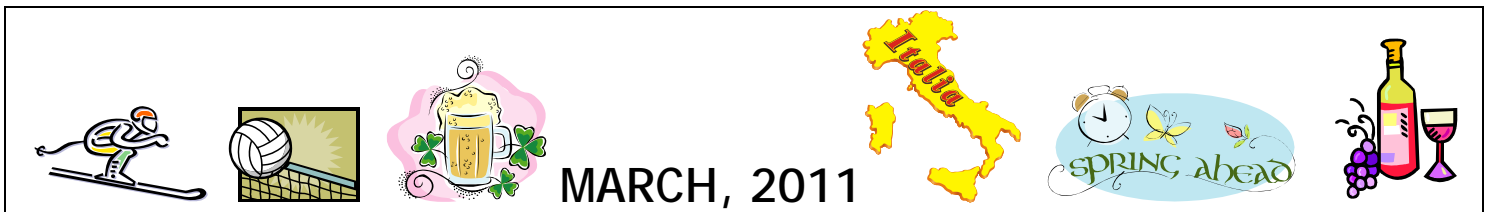
