

SJSC Jackson Hole Feb 8th-Feb 15th 2020

Early morning on February 8th, our first group of 44 met at PHL for a 6 am flight to Jackson Hole. We heard that Jackson was having a snowstorm coming in.

Excitement and lots of coffee at a 3 am wake up time helped as we boarded our first flight to Denver. Once in Denver our 2nd leg was supposed to be a short connection. Mother nature stepped in and our connection was a 3-hour adventure to Idaho Falls! Luckily we were met by cheerful crew and airport staff to relax, settle our stomachs, refuel and get back to Jackson.
